## **Policy Updates**

### Scottish Flexible Workforce Scheme extended

The Flexible Workforce Development Pilot has been extended by the Scottish Government for another year. The fund can be accessed by levy paying firms in Scotland and allows a maximum spend of £15,000 per company. **Read more here**.

#### Committee publishes robust judgement on STEM delivery

The Public Accounts Committee released a robust report on 'Delivering STEM skills for the economy'. We have reviewed and analysed the report – read the summary here.

#### First National Infrastructure Assessment released

The National Infrastructure Commission's assessment aims to take a long-term, sectoral view of the needs of the UK and to support sustainable economic growth, improve competitiveness, and quality of life. **Read more** or **access the full report**.

#### Construction Leadership Council publishes procurement reform strategy

Joining up with the recent **construction industry sector deal**, this new strategy aims to focus clients on quality, rather than price, by advocating reform and standardisation. Employment and skills is also recognised as a key strategic theme. You can read the **full report here**.

#### Apprenticeship service starts down 39%

There were 24,100 starts recorded in April 2018, compared with around 39,400 in April 2016 according to the latest **Education and Skills Funding Agency's monthly apprenticeship statistics update**. Recent analysis has revealed that starts are 22% down from where they need to be for the government to meet its target of 3m apprenticeship starts by 2020. **Read more**.

#### 2-month notice period for reduced apprenticeship funding rates

Apprenticeship funding bands currently under review by the Institute for Apprenticeships will be given a minimum two-month notice period if their funding rate is reduced. But in the case of standards whose funding rate increases, the change will be immediate. **Read more**.
