

# NATIONAL AND REGIONAL LABOUR MARKET PROFILES 2024

The data contained in this dashboard highlights the variations that exist around the nations and regions of the UK across 14 separate labour market indicators.

Each devolved nation and English region has been ranked in terms of their relative performance against each indicator.

However, it should be noted that as labour markets are extremely complicated concepts and rarely conform to a statistical summary based on such a wide range of factors, this analysis should be treated as indicative only.

The map opposite shows how the 12 nations and regions of the UK are ranked in the following order (from “best” performing to “worst”) based on their average rank across the 14 indicators.

In theory, attracting and retaining the right skills could prove to be more of a challenge in those nations and regions which are ranked towards the bottom of this list.

Conversely, in those nations and regions which are ranked towards the top of this list, it is likely attracting and retaining the right skills could be easier.

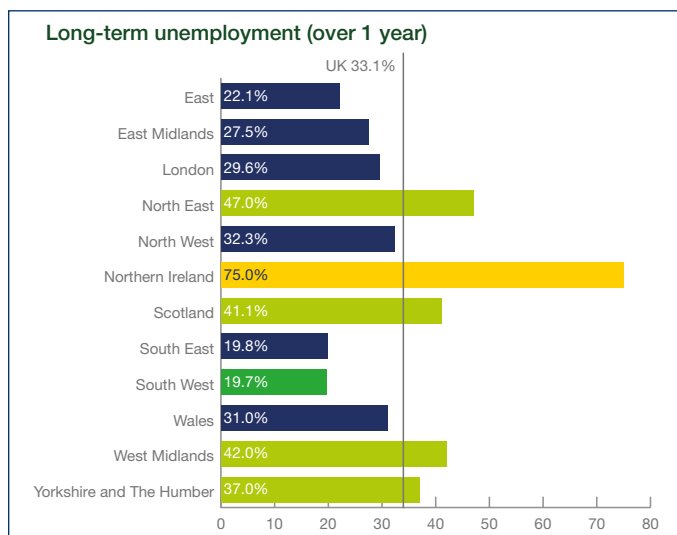
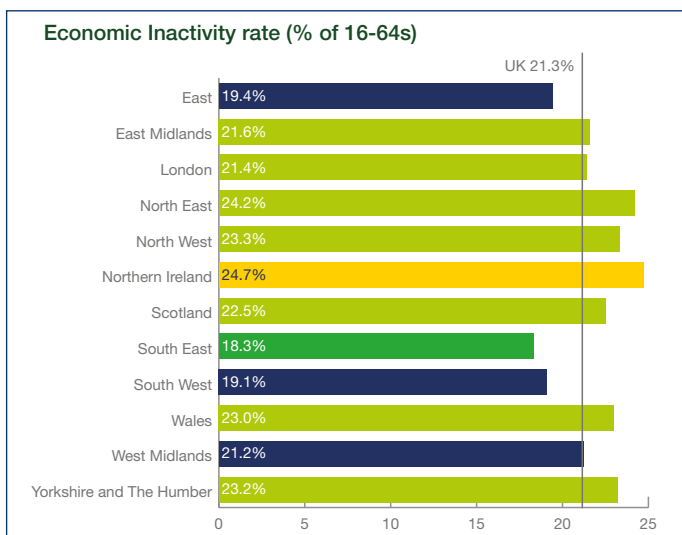
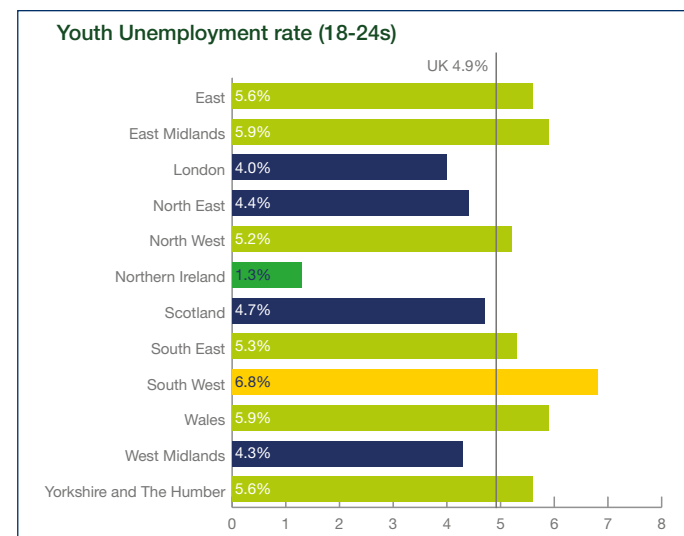
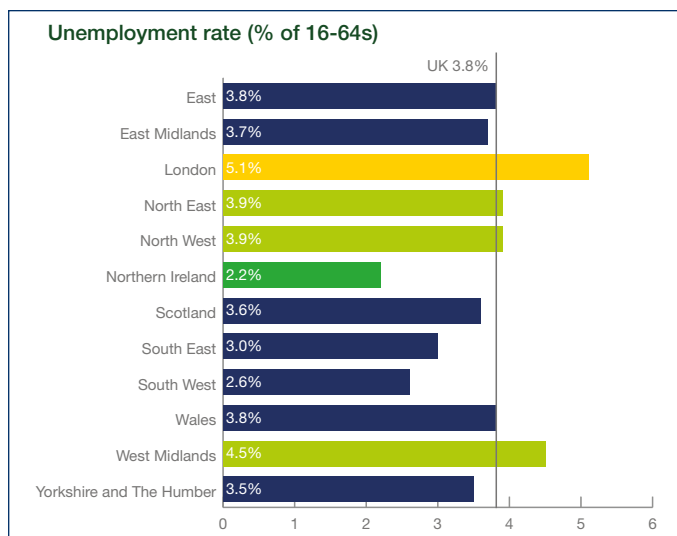
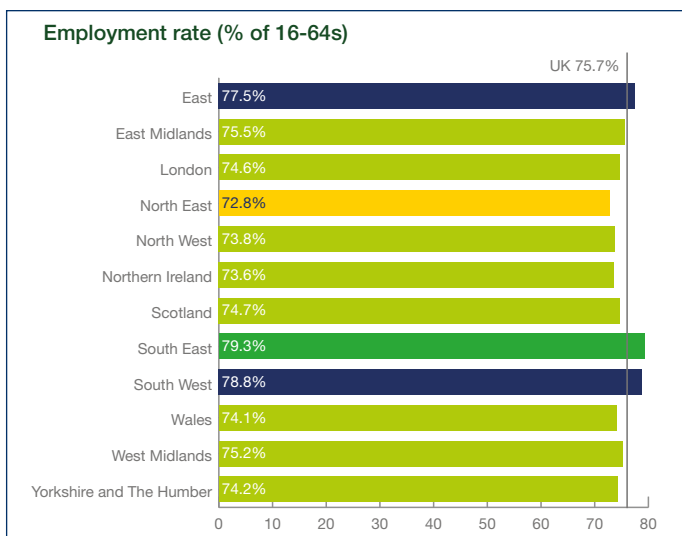
# Resident Population

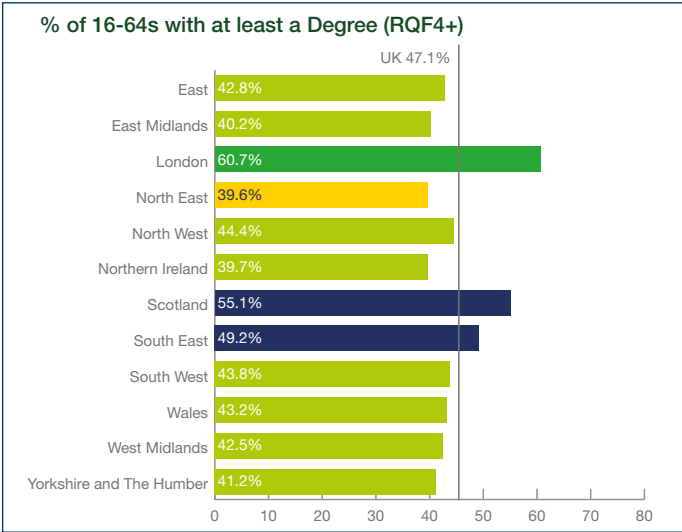
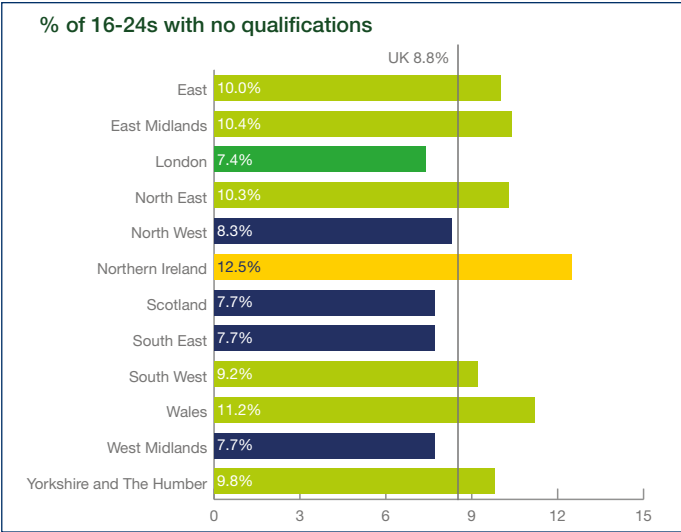
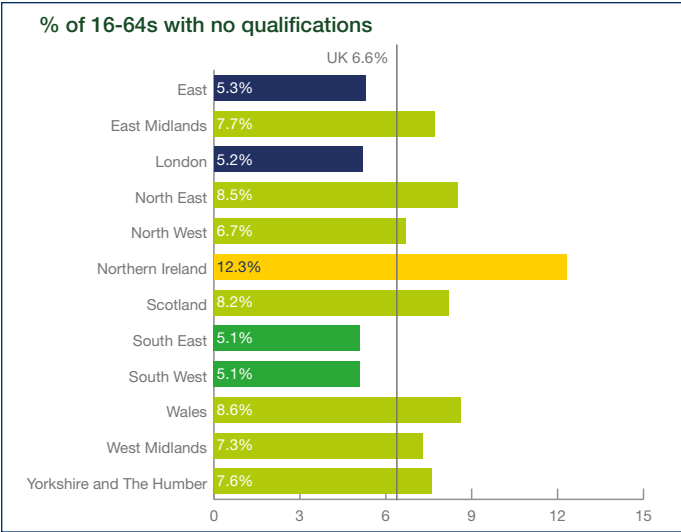
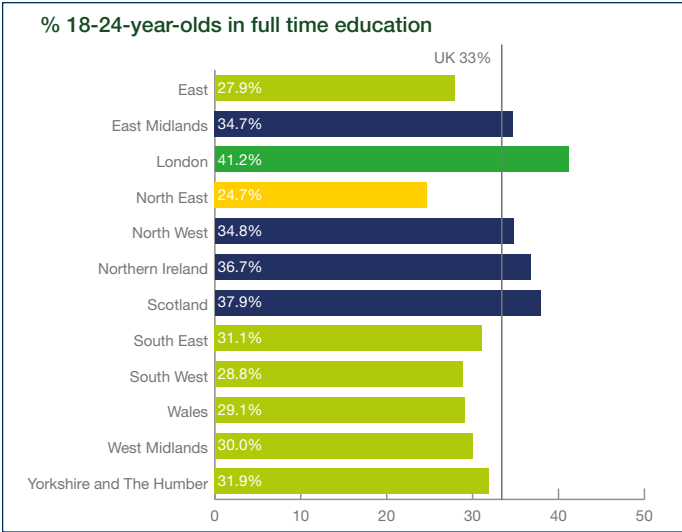
# Economic Status
